NDDOT Budget contains township funding

We've been highlighting the efforts of the NDDOT in **House Bill 1012** to enhance township road funding in our Capitol Updates. This week, more details have emerged what that will actually look like as the Session winds down.

With only 20 days remaining to finalize the budget, the Senate Appropriations Government Operations Division amended HB 1012 as it came from the House, and sent it to the full Appropriations Committee for consideration.

As of now, the idea is to take the Motor Vehicle Excise Tax and place 50% of that into the newly-created Flexible Transportation Fund, and up to \$100M into the Highway Tax Distribution Fund. This money will be disbursed according to current formulas. The thought is if the total distributed is larger, political subdivisions will ALL get more funds. Negotiations on exactly how much county and bridge funding will be appropriated are still ongoing.

Prairie Dog funding bill passes House

Senate Bill 2367 disburses oil and gas revenues from the State into various "buckets." As the buckets fill up with tax revenue, the next bucket fills and so forth. The "prairie dog" buckets, which provide infrastructure payments to political subdivisions are expected to fill this biennium due to robust oil and gas revenues that are projected.

Emergency snow removal bill signed; as April storm bears down on State

Senate Bill 2183 provides emergency snow removal grants to political subdivisions and tribal communities. The bill saw several formulas during the process, ultimately it was passed and signed by Governor Burgum on April 4, just as the first flakes of snow fell in Bismarck this past week.

Townships who may qualify for additional funding have until May 31 to apply, and should contact their county emergency service office for further information and assistance.
